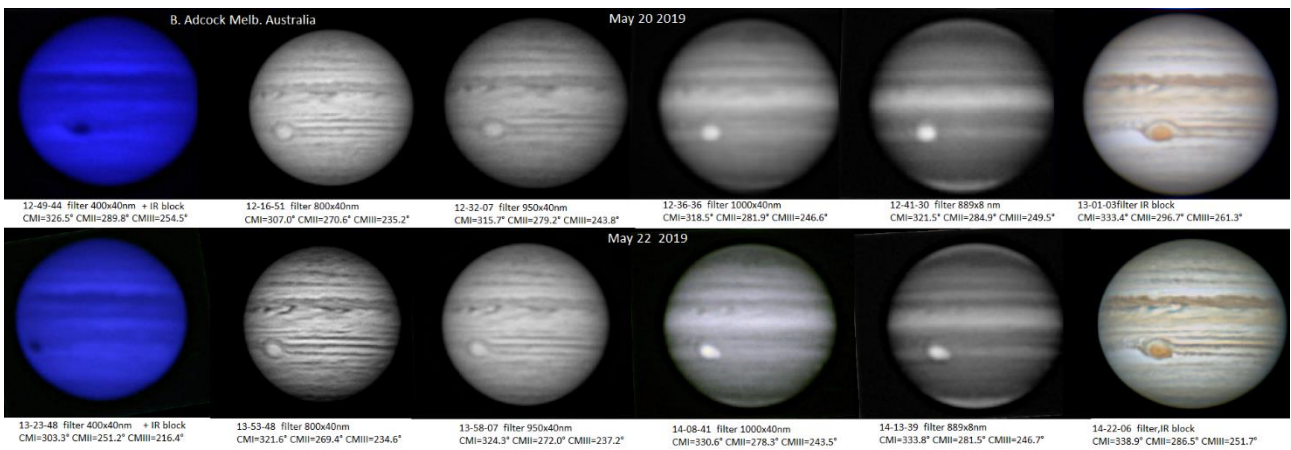
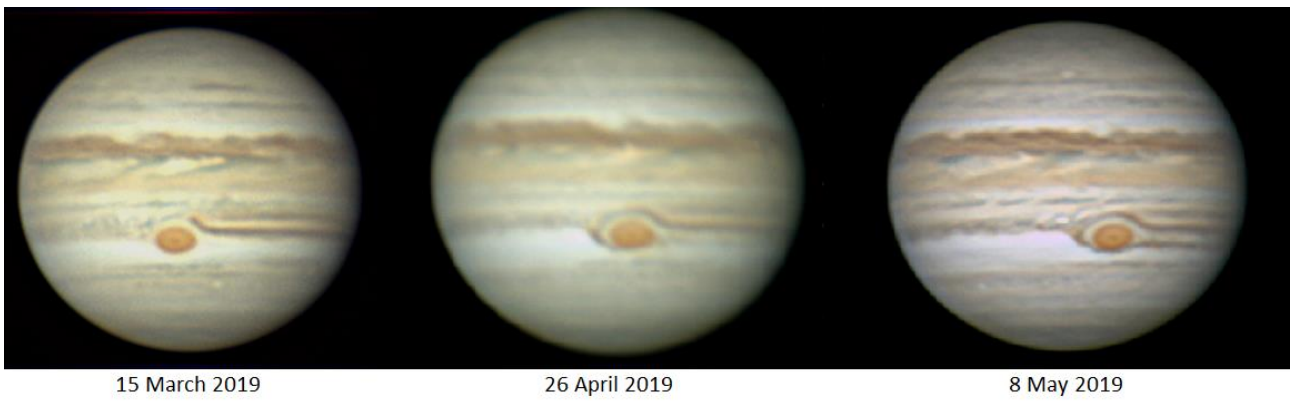
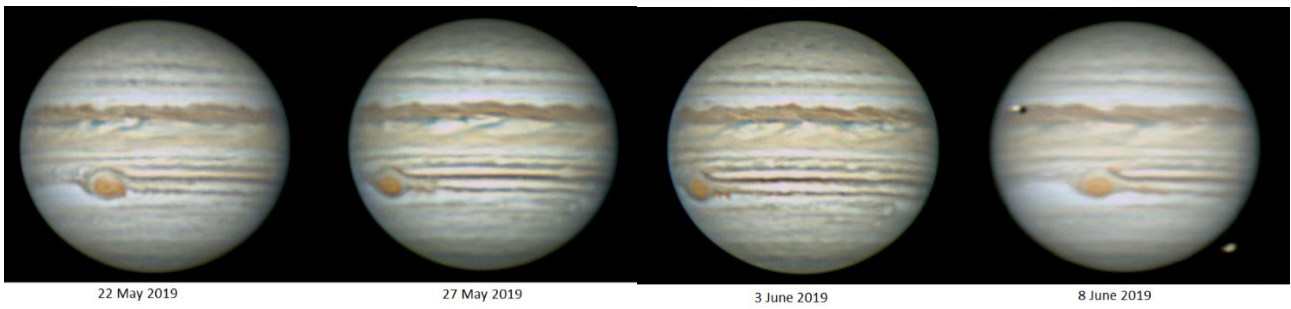
The Great Red Spot undergoing change

The attached pictures show a progression of layers peeling off the GRS. The action starts at the following end and moves to the preceding end. It is possible to trace red stuff being carried to the east with local atmospheric currents.

There also appears to be local pockets of red material scattered round the spot. The difference in quality is due to our own air.

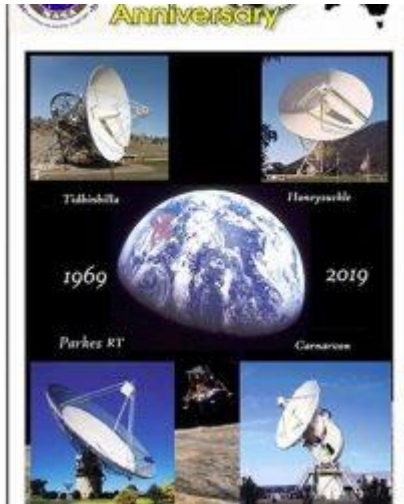
